BASS LAKE

The camp is situated on the small recreation waters of Bass Lake. We have a large area designated for swimming with a safety rope marking off the deeper water from the shallow area. The camp has many life jackets and it is camp policy that a life jacket must be worn while in any boat. Within the swim area there is a swim raft. We have a waterslide and safety mats for its use. The camp owns canoes, kayaks, paddleboats, and a small fishing boat, plus a wide variety of fun things to do in the water. We have a speedboat that can be rented, provided a camp employee drives the boat. Speedboat activities include tubing for younger kids and a choice of tubing, kneeboarding, skiing for teens. Renters are responsible for providing their own lifeguards.



KITCHEN/DINING AREA

This new facility (built in 2010) is able to seat 200. The dining area can also double as a workshop/craft area. The commercial kitchen has a range/oven, convection oven, warm holding units, walk-in cooler, walk-in freezer and dishwasher. The camp provides all the pots, pans, tableware, etc. This building has some patio furniture outside under a canopy. The basement to this building serves as shelter area from storms.













PLAY AREA

Activites include merry-go-round, two swing sets, a Rainbow play area (swings, slide, climbing wall, etc.), two tetherball poles, sand pit volleyball, horseshoes, many carpetball tables, box hockey, mini golf and Gagaball. An asphalt area has a basketball court and tennis court on it. The camp has a 9 hole professional style disc golf course throughout the property. A rec shed is nearby to hold all sporting goods equipment. A large open area is suitable for team sport activities.



CLIMBING WALL

In 2009 the camp built a four-sided climbing tower. Each side has varying degrees of difficulty. The camp is able to offer this activity for an additional fee. The camp provides all equipment, certified workers, and complete instructions in the safe use of the activity. Climbers must have parental permission and be appropriately dressed (no excessive floppy clothes and must have closed toe shoes).
